Senior Class president Wipe McClean announced today that the Class of '68 has finally, after much consideration and spontaneous deliberation, decided upon its traditional gift to the University.

Several proposals were discussed before the quorum arrived. SPU president A. B. Stalvorsin suggested a 100 ton Albrecht to be placed south of Krudler Hall. The idea was rejected because, as several representatives from Krudler pointed out, such a device would not be effective in solving the alleged problem. Not only have we provided the funds necessary to maintain the fountain until next year when we hope the Class of '69 will follow our sobering lead, but we have managed to provide six different brands: Monday will feature Olympus; Tuesday, Heidelberg; Wednesday, Rainiest; Thursday, Lucky Logger; Friday, Spamm's; and on the week-end, that king of beers, Buddywiser."

PLU President Dr. R. OR. Moredebt commented: "This is one of the most original gifts ever presented to the University. It shows a deep concern for the purposes
