## **KNIGHT HOOPSTERS HAVE IMPORTANT TESTS AT WILLAMETTE FRIDAY, SATURDAY**

PLU's basketball Knights take to the road for five games, hoping to maintain their bid for the Northwest Conference title as well as nail down a berth in the NAIA District I playoffs later this month.

The men of Gene Lundgaard made a successful bid to move back into the NWC race last week with a 93-71 triumph over Pacific and an 81-73 overtime win over league-leading Linfield.

The victories elevated the Knights to a 10-3 conference record and a 14-4 ledger for the season.

PLU needs only two more victories to assure itself of a berth in the NAIA District I playoffs which are scheduled to open Feb. 26. The triumphs would assure the Knights of the best independent record in the district.

Willamette University will furnish the opposition for the Knights Friday and Saturday with both games set for Salem, Ore. PLU owns an earlier 79-70 victory over the Bearcats.

Following the set with Willamette, the Knights will meet three non-conference foes on the road.

On Monday, Feb. 14, PLU will face cross-town rival Puget Sound in a game that has been moved back from its previous Feb. 15 date. The Knights defeated the Loggers 79-58 earlier in the season.

PLU will be at Seattle Pacific Feb. 18 and Western Washington Feb. 19 before returning home to meet College of Idaho Feb. 21.

Curt Gammell continues to lead the Knights in both scoring and rebounding with respective averages of 19.7 and 14.4.

## **MRYL ALEXANDER FEATURED SPEAKER FOR SOCIAL LIFE SERIES FEB. 20-22**

Myrl Alexander, director of the Bureau of Prisons, U. S. Department of Justice, will be the featured speaker at Pacific Lutheran University's social life series on "Crime and Its Prevention" Feb. 20-22.

Alexander, who has held his present position since August 1964, will present three lectures at PLU. His first appearance will be Sunday, Feb. 20, at 8 p.m., speaking on the subject of "Crime and Delinquency: Whose Responsibility." PLU will confer an honorary degree upon him during this program.

He also will speak Feb. 21 and 22 at 4:30 p.m. on the respective subjects of "The Role of Higher Education in Crime and Prevention Control" and "Current Concepts of Corrections."

All sessions are open to the public and will be held in the Eastvold Chapel auditorium.

Alexander has had more than 30 years experience in the Federal Prison Service, including 14 years as assistant director from 1947 to 1961. He served as professor of correctional administration and director of the center for study of crime delinquency and control at Southern Illinois University from 1961-64.

He obtained his A.B. degree from Manchester College, pursued graduate studies at Bucknell University and also holds an LL.D. degree from Manchester College.

EXPRESSION SERIES TO FEATURE "THE CONGO" NEXT FRIDAY

"The Congo--Tribal Africa at the Crossroads," a film-lecture by Lewis Cotlow, will be presented as part of the Pacific Lutheran University Associated Students Expression Series at 8 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 19, in the Eastvold Chapel auditorium.

Cotlow has photographed and observed the Congo for more than 25 years. Sub-Sahara Africa has been his specialty, primitive people his focus, animals his joy, the Congo's fate his concern.

In color film, he shows Central Africa as it will never be photographed again. Based on this film record, his lecture draws conclusions on tribal Africa at the crossroads, a key factor in the tragedy that is the Congo today.

Cotlow is one of the world's outstanding explorers. He has traveled in 109 countries and has made 12 major expeditions. Some of his books have been published in seven languages. He is the author of "Passport to Adventure," "Amazon Head Hunters," "Zanzabuku" and "In Search of the Primitive."
