PLU's Chemistry Department and School of Education. Computer hardware and software totaling \$9,000 was awarded to Craig Fryhle (Chemistry) from Union Pacific Foundation to increase laboratory safety and environmental awareness for students in chemical laboratories. Two Eisenhower Mathematics and Science grants were awarded to the School of Education by the State Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, the third consecutive year two grants were awarded to PLU. The first, a \$28,080 grant, was awarded to **Terry Ford** and Marie Churney for "Integrating Science, Math and Social Studies through Technology in Elementary Schools," a program designed to support staff development in mathematics and science in area public schools. Finally, \$28,538 was received by Greg Nelson and Ralph **Vedros** for "Hands-on Science: Improving Elementary Science Instruction," a project in collaboration with Peninsula School District.
