Prerequisites can be ascertained from the general catalog. In most cases iower division course: are hasic anc should be completed before registering for upper division courses.

A student must have a grade point averitge of 2.25 to be eligible to register for any courses in the School of Education. Any exception must he approved by we Director of the School of Education.

The letters L1, L2, L3, etc., refer to the laboratory sections. Tie letter $S$ with a number ( $\mathrm{S} 1, \mathrm{~S} 2, \mathrm{~S} 3$ ) refers CO class sections. The letter $D$ with a number D1, D2, D3, refers to discussion groups.

The time for courses is given according to periods in the day, except far certain day and evening courses where the hour and day are given.
