




## THE LAYING OF THE CORNER STONE

THE corner stone of the Pacific Lutheran College Library was laid on October 23, 1937. The above picture, taken at the time of the ceremony, includes: First row—N. J. Hong, chairman of the program committee for the occasion; Dr. O. A. Tingelstad, president of Pacific Lutheran College; Roy T. Emley, contractor; D. C. R. Sorenson, ~~secretary~~ of the Augsburg Synod on the Board of Trustees; Conrad Hansen, member of building committee; H. A. Bell, architect; F. H. Madren, sub-contractor; George Grove, ~~secretary~~; Theodore Noltemeier, secretary of Building committee; Second row—Rev. Gustav Mittel, pastor, chairman of Building committee; C. F. Jorg, Inspector; Dr. L. G. Dahl, pioneer pastor; H. E. Anderson, treasurer of endowment fund; Rev. Ig. J. Thorpe, also president of Pacific district; J. W. McCune, Pasco Chamber of Commerce; J. U. Xavier, librarian; Axel Ostholm, chairman of Ebenezer campaign; Prof. P. Paulus, organizer of library campaign; Rev. L. Ludwig, senior representative of American Lutheran Church on Board of Trustees; Rev. A. M. Kreabel, president of Board of Trustees.

The formal ceremony was preceded by a dinner, in which twenty-five guests of honor had been invited, seventeen of whom comprise the Golden Jubilee Committee, which is to function until the fiftieth anniversary, 1944.

At the formal program Rev. A. M. Kreabel presided. Dr. C. R. Guernsey pronounced the invocation and the "Choir of the West," directed by Prof. G. J. Melmin, sang Christensen's "Hosanna."

The principal address was delivered by President O. A. Tingelstad, who reviewed in detail the history of the Library Campaign and explained the significance of the library to the College and its constituency. He thereupon introduced Prof. N. J. Hong, the oldest teacher at the College, who read the following list of the historical documents to be placed in the stone:

1. The Bible, Lutheran Hymnary, Book of Concord, and President Tingelstad's address.
2. Copies of Lutheran Herald, Lutheran Companion, and Lutheran Standard.
3. Copies of Pacific Herald, containing accounts of the dedication of the College, October 14, 1894, and the celebration of its fortieth anniversary, October 14, 1934.
4. The last issue of Pacific Herald and the Columbia Lutheran and the first three issues of their successor, the Western Lutheran.
5. Copies of Southwest and the Journal of the American Lutheran Conference.
6. A copy of the Constitution of the Pacific Historical Society of the Baltic Peoples.
7. The program of the 1936 local pageant, etc.
8. A complete list of all donations, from \$0 cents to \$10,000.

Thereupon President Tingelstad read the prescribed ritual and declared the corner stone laid in the name of the Triune God. The choir then sang "Beautiful Savior," whereupon Rev. T. O. Sorensen pronounced his benediction.
