PLU named number nine in Western universities

It's year number two in place number nine: PLU was ranked ninth in the top 15 Western region universities in the U.S. News & World Report 1997 America's Best Colleges issue and guidebook. PLU tied for the position with Mt. St. Mary's College of California. The rankings were based on academic reputation, retention, faculty resources, student selectivity, financial resources and the alumni giving rate. PLU is the only Northwest school to be listed in all of the magazine's surveys since the practice began in 1983. PLU also ranked 10th out of the 15 for "best value," up from 12th last year.

Wellness Clinic receives booster grant

Health services for adolescents in Parkland and Spanaway through the PLU Wellness Clinic received a boost with a \$1,500 grant from the Pierce County Medical Society Alliance. The clinic, part of the Wellness Center on East Campus, is a nurse-managed center staffed by three advanced registered nurse practitioners. It offers primary care services such as physicals, preventative health care and women's health care, all without state or federal subsidies. This is the second year the clinic has received a grant from the alliance. The funds help buy medications and health care supplies for those who can't afford them, as well as health care literature and other resources.

KPLU news staff members received two national awards as part of the Public Radio News Directors Inc. 1997 awards competition. Reporters **Steve Krueger** and **Paula Wissel** shared a first-place award for series/documentary reporting with the story "Bellwether Communities," a piece in which they interviewed people in Puget Sound communities to gauge public awareness of election issues. The story aired as part of the on-going Front Porch Forum project. Paula Wissel also won a PRNDI second-place award for breaking news with "Talking Down the Plane," a report on a passenger who landed a plane after the pilot passed out. The PRNDI awards are the only national competition for outstanding public radio local news reporting. KPLU news staff have earned more than 30 journalistic honors this year.
