Noted black leader speaks on "race rules"

Michael Eric Dyson, noted black author, Baptist minister and distinguished professor of African American history at Columbia University, gives a free talk on his latest book, "Race Rules: Navigating the Color Line," from 1:30-3 pm on Oct. 1 in the CK. A book signing and reception follow the talk. In his book, Dyson reveals the pernicious influence of racial thinking across the broad canvas of American social and cultural life, from the disjunction between how whites and blacks view the world to the way perceptions of black masculinity thwart black leadership. He draws examples from the black community -- sexual conflict in the black church, the myth of the "head Negro," relations between black men and women -- to describe the ongoing failure to break free of the rule of race. Dyson has also written books exploring the myth and meaning of Malcolm X, bearing witness to black culture ("Between God and Gangsta Rap"), and African American cultural criticism.

A lecture by and reception for **Alfredo Arreguín**, internationally-acclaimed Mexican- American artist, will be at 7 pm on Oct. 9 in the University Gallery.

Arreguín tells stories through his works, which weave together patterns from colonial Mexican art, Baroque church facades, and animal and floral motifs. His works are in the gallery Oct. 6-31.
