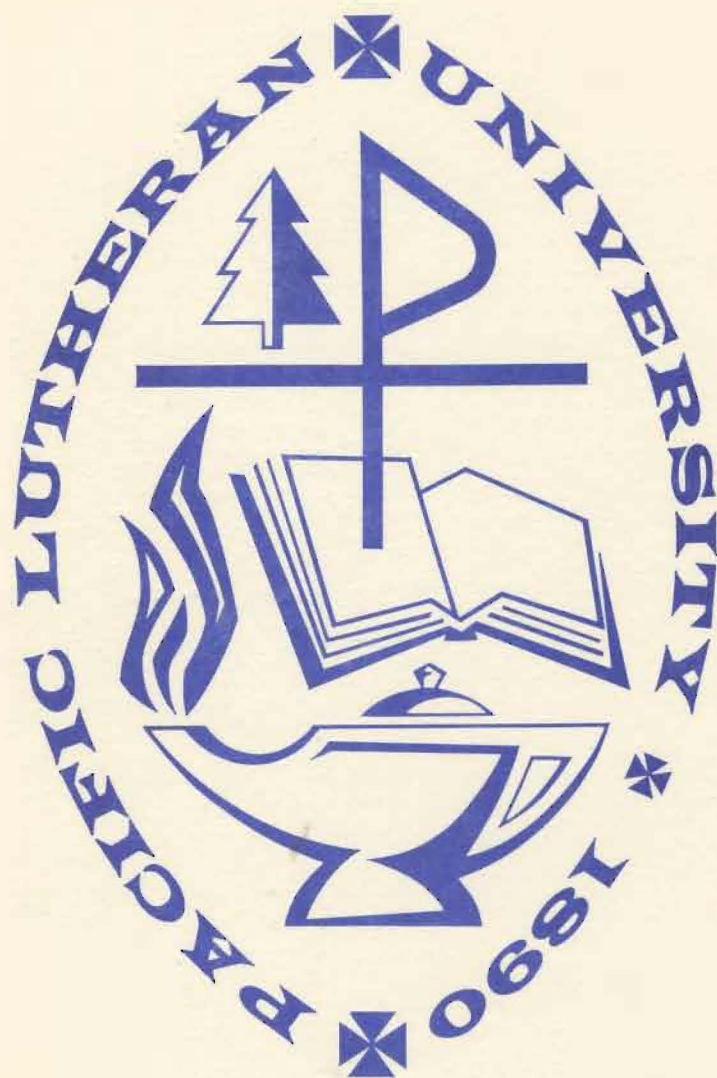

GENERAL REGISTRATION DIRECTIONS

1. All students currently in school, who plan to register for the following semester, (summer excepted) should register by Advance Registration, to avoid any long registration lines.
2. New students and students returning to the University, after the absence of a semester or more (summer excepted) should register in person. Exceptions to this rule are for special courses off campus and PART TIME STUDENTS.
3. Selective Service - Attention All Male Students
If you want your local draft board notified of your full-time enrollment at PLU, it is your responsibility to complete a form in the Registrar's Office. This is normally done only once a year.
4. V.A. Benefits
If you expect to receive any type of veteran or war orphan benefits, you must file your certificate of eligibility in the Registrar's Office. Forms and information concerning veterans benefits are available in the Registrar's Office. Make application when registering.
5. Be certain to read the general University requirements on pages 41 and 42 of the catalog.
6. Obtain your registration materials at the Registrar's Office.
7. Secure an appointment with your adviser. DO THIS IMMEDIATELY.
8. Print with a BLACK LEAD PENCIL on your official program.
 - a. Fill in all personal information including your Social Security Number. If you do not have a Social Security Number, you must secure one prior to registering.
 - b. Enter courses and credits in the space provided. Be sure you have indicated the section, lab and discussion group if these are designated in the printed schedule.
 - c. If you have work, transportation, or other activities that will affect the arrangement of your schedule, note them in the area provided.
 - d. Print an "A" before audit courses and "R" before repeat courses in the column provided.
 - e. Check to be certain that you have the pre-requisites as indicated in the catalog for courses you select.
 - f. List alternate courses which can be substituted if courses on your original schedule are closed. The listing of alternate courses may prevent a change of registration in the spring.
 - g. Obtain permission signatures where indicated in the time schedule.
 - h. If you have a known conflict of hours, obtain written permission for the conflict from the department concerned. Authorization signatures must appear in the instructor area of the official program.
 - i. Obtain the signature of your adviser if you are a full-time student.

Advance Registration Only

- A. Leave your registration materials with the Registrar's Office.
- B. In advance registration, programs are accepted by class, with seniors first; then juniors, sophomores and freshmen. Every effort is made to comply with your requests. If a course is closed, an approved alternate will be substituted.
- C. You will be mailed a statement of charges, a copy of your scheduled classes, additional instructions and cards.
- D. Return your payment and the other information requested, by the due date indicated.
- E. If your payment is received by the due date, your registration will be complete. If your payment is not received by the due date, your registration will be cancelled and it will be necessary for you to register in person. You will be notified of the due date when you receive your registration materials in the mail.

In Person Registration

- A. Obtain the necessary cards at the Registrar's Office.
- B. Complete all cards. Obtain adviser's approval if full-time.
- C. Report to the Registrar's Office to be scheduled.
- D. As soon as you are scheduled and receive a copy of your program, report to the Business Office to pay your fees.

PASS-FAIL OPTION

- A. Undergraduate students may elect to register for up to four courses on the pass-fail basis, limited to one course per semester, and to no more than two courses per calendar year (including summer session).
- B. Courses required by the University for graduation, or in the student's major field, will not be taken on the pass-fail system.
- C. Pass and fail grades will not alter the GPA, but credits earned with a passing grade will count towards graduation.
- D. Students must obtain a pass-fail permission slip from his adviser for any course taken on the pass-fail basis. Students will not be allowed to change to the pass-fail basis after the semester has begun.
- E. Students must declare to the course professor that they are taking the course on the pass-fail basis during the first week of classes.
- F. Pass-fail students will be responsible for all course work and all examinations. Instructors should make out letter grades for the entire class and submit these to the Registrar; but only P-F grades will be issued and recorded on the student's transcripts.
- G. An entire course will not be converted to the pass-fail basis by student vote even if more than 50% of the students in the course, in a given semester, are on the pass-fail basis.
- H. After the course has begun, or after it has been concluded, a pass-fail student who wishes to receive a letter grade for the course may apply for such credit with the approval of the instructor. This is for the purpose of enabling such a student to major in the field in which he has taken a required course on the pass-fail basis. Such conversion will not entitle the student to another pass-fail option.
- I. Pass grades (P) shall be equal to letter grades A through C, while fail grades (F, not E) will be equal to letter grades D and E. The pass and fail keys on the computer (P or F) will thus withhold the pass-fail credits in the computation of GPA. Students who receive the fail grade are penalized in that their credits will not count towards the 128 required for graduation, and that the "F" grade will be recorded on student transcripts. Students will not be penalized by a reduction in GPA.

Change of Registration

1. Obtain a change of registration card and an appointment for change of registration, at the information desk.
2. Obtain your adviser's signature.
3. Obtain permission signatures where indicated in this schedule for any classes you plan to enter.
4. Report to the Registrar's Office at designated time on the appointment card.
5. NOTICE: Your University Identification Card must be presented at the Registrar's Office for completing your change of registration.

The 1968-69 Class Schedule offerings are listed alphabetically according to departments and schools.

Courses open to freshmen and sophomores are numbered 101-299, and are considered lower division subjects. Courses open to juniors and seniors are numbered 300-499 and are regarded as upper division subjects. Courses numbered 500 are open to graduate students only.

Lower division students may take upper division courses and have them apply toward the 40 hour requirement. This opportunity will be quite limited since pre-requisites must first be met. Pre-requisites can be ascertained from the general catalog. In most cases lower division courses are basic and should be completed before registering for upper division courses.

A student must have a grade point average of 2.25 to be eligible to register for any courses in the School of Education. Any exception must be approved by the Director of the School of Education.

The time for courses is given according to periods in the day, except for certain day and evening courses where the hour and day are given.

The University reserves the right to cancel any class for justifiable cause.
