Graduate-program nurses awarded traineeships

Training graduate-program nurses who will give direct client care is the focus of a \$45,733 grant from the federal Department of Health and Human Services. The grant will fund traineeships for students in the nurse practitioner and client systems manager programs at PLU, students who will serve the community as primary health care providers following graduation. **Cleo Pass** (Nursing), who submitted the grant, said this is the seventh year the school has received these funds. The total money given has risen steadily each year, since the initial award of around \$18,000.

Wellness Clinic receives booster grant

The health services the PLU Wellness Center provides for local adolescents received a boost with a \$1,500 grant from the Pierce County Medical Society Alliance. The clinic, part of the Wellness Center on East Campus, is a nurse-managed center staffed by three advanced registered nurse practitioners. It primarily serves Parkland and Spanaway residents, offering primary care services such as physicals, preventative health care and women's health care, all without state or federal subsidies. This is the second year the clinic has received a grant from the alliance. The funds help buy medications and health care supplies for those who can't afford them, as well as health care literature and other resources.
